THE PARISH COUNCILS BUILDING ACT

- 1. This Act may be cited as the Parish Councils Building Short title. Act.
- 2.—(1) The Parish Council of any parish in the Island Power to other than the parishes of Kingston and Saint Andrew may laws as to make by-laws generally for regulating the erection, altera-erection, etc. of tion and repair of buildings within the limits of any town buildings. or of any rural area defined by any such Parish Council.

- (2) Without prejudice to the generality of the power conferred by subsection (1), by-laws may be made prescribing the fees to be charged for the issue of a building permit and the hearing of an appeal against the refusal of a Parish Council to issue a building permit.
- (3) In relation to the parishes of Kingston and Saint Andrew the power to make by-laws conferred by this section may be exercised by the Building Authority constituted under the Kingston and St. Andrew Building Act.

3. Such by-laws shall be subject to the approval of the Approval Minister, who may confirm, alter, or add to same. Such publication by-laws, when finally approved as aforesaid, shall be of by-laws. published in the Gazette, and shall thereafter have the force and effect of law.

4. Any person acting contrary to, or failing to comply Penalty, with, or who shall be guilty of a breach of, or offence and method of against any by-law, as aforesaid, shall be liable to a penalty recovery

not exceeding twenty dollars, and to a daily penalty of four dollars for every day during which such breach or offence continues after conviction. Such penalties shall be recoverable in a summary manner, and in default of payment, such person shall be liable to imprisonment, with or without hard labour, for a term not exceeding three months.
