Horace Mair</i>	The Defendant is charged with shooting twenty-three (23) Bald-pate Doves at Dovecot Memorial Park, Kirkpatrick, Orange, St. James contrary to The Wild Life Protection (Game Bird Hunting Limit) Regulations, 2004, Reg. 2	<u>Decisions/Order(s)</u>  The defendant was convicted and fined \$30,000.00
<i>R v. Dancorp Limited, Dansinghani Bindu and Dansinghani Gabind.</i> Information No. 2992/ 2015	The Defendant/Company is charged under Section 9(2) of the Natural Resources Conservation Authority Act for operating a nature based tourism attraction without a permit.	<u>Decisions/Orders granted:</u>  On August 10, 2017 the defendant pleaded guilty and was fined \$20,000.00
<i>R v. Proprietors Strata Plan No. 561 (Gardens of Arcadia)</i>	The Defendant was charged with operating a sewage treatment facility contrary to section 9 (2) of the Natural Resources Conservation Authority Act without the requisite licence.	<u>Decisions/Orders granted:</u>  On October 30, 2017 the defendants pleaded guilty and were charged a fine of \$20,000.00

R v Nohaud Azan; Silhouette Bay Limited; Bobby Chang; Gobind Purshotamdas Mahtani	The Defendants are charged with breaches of the Beach Control Act. More Specifically:  i. Bobby Chang – submerged rubble breakwater; ii. Bobby Chang – Encroachment of 27 pylons;	<u>Decisions/Orders granted:</u>  Mention December 12 2017
	iii. Nohaud Azan – Encroachment of a groyne; iv. Nohaud Aza - v. Silhouette Bay Limited - Encroachment of a groyne; vi. Silhouette Bay Limited - Encroachment of 10 pylons; vii. Gobond Purshotamdas Mahtani - 10 sand bags; viii. Gobond Purshotamdas Mahtani - Encroachment of 8 pylons.	<u>Decisions/Orders granted:</u>  Defendants pleaded guilty on September 13, 2017 and were fined \$150,000.00 for each offence.
R v. Orville Webb and R v. Rashidi Williams	The Defendants were charged with breaches of the Beach Control Act. More Specifically:  1. Encroaching on the foreshore and floor of the sea and floor of the sea by dredging without a Beach Licence.  2. Encroaching on the foreshore and floor of the sea by dredging without a Beach Licence.  3. Encroaching on the foreshore and floor of the Sea by reclamation, through Dumping of boulders on the Foreshore and Floor of the Sea without a Licence	<u>Decisions/Orders granted:</u>  The Defendants pleaded guilty. R v. Neil Miller and R v. Brandon Miller	Breach of the s. 3(1) of the Wild Life Protection (Hunters Licences) Regulations	<u>Decisions/Orders granted:</u> Trial, November 27, 2017
R v. Neville J. Melvin	Breach of the s. 3(1) of the Wild Life Protection (Hunters Licences) Regulations	<u>Decisions/Orders granted:</u> Mention, October 31, 2017
R v. Ronnie Elmhirst	Breach of the s. 9(1) of the Beach Control Act	<u>Decisions/Orders granted:</u> Mention, August 22, 2017, Ms. Elmhirst ordered to collect and pay for her Beach Licence.  [Ms. Elmhirst complied on September 5, 2017]
R v. Richard Wates	Breach of the s. ii of the Wild Life Protection Act	<u>Decisions/Orders granted:</u> The Defendant pleaded guilty and was sentenced on August 9, 2017 to a fine of \$70,000.00 or thirty days in prison.
<i>R v. Harish Lachmandas et al</i>	Discharge of Sewage Effluent into Waters, on the Ground or into the Ground at Millsborough Gully Behind Wiggan Loop, Barbican Mews Contrary to the Natural Resources Conservation Act, 1991, s. 12	<u>Decisions/Orders granted:</u> Mentioned, October 10, 2017.
